

## History of the U.S. Naval War College

Founded in Newport, Rhode Island on October 6, 1884, the Naval War College is the oldest war college in the nation, and the first military service institution in the world to be designated a war college. Commodore Stephen B. Luce was the first president and organized the War College as "a place of original research on all questions relating to war and the statesmanship connected with war, or the prevention of war." These foundations were built upon by Captain Alfred Thayer Mahan, second president of the college, who had originally been selected by Luce to initiate the course in Naval History. Of all the men who were to influence the institution in its early years, none was to have such a profound impact. Mahan's views profoundly affected such leaders as Henry Cabot Lodge and Theodore Roosevelt and, through them and others, helped shape the United States' destiny at the turn of the century. Mahan's writings published as *The Influence of Seapower Upon History, 1660-1783* gained him worldwide acclaim and established the Naval War College as an internationally respected institution.

Functioning continuously since 1884, except for brief periods during the Spanish-American War and World War I, the War College numbers among its graduates such distinguished naval officers as Admirals Sims, Spruance, King, Nimitz, and Halsey, in addition to many others who today are holding prominent military positions.

The work begun more than one hundred years ago by Luce and Mahan continues today. As graduates well know, the curriculum is both demanding and rewarding. For the military professional, the education provided by the Naval War College is unrivaled.

## THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION AND REGALIA

For centuries, institutions of higher learning have dignified their ceremonies with an academic procession, a custom descending from the clerical procession. The procession is led by a marshal, followed by the student body and the academicians or faculty, each attired in the robes prescribed for his degree. Distinguished visitors and delegates follow the faculty, and last in the procession comes the president of the institution.

Each member of an academic procession ordinarily wears a cap, gown, and hood. In the procession today military faculty will not wear academic gowns. The earliest illustration of gowns worn at Oxford University somewhat resembles cassocks worn by English teachers who found good use for the hood, or cowl, as protection against the weather. A uniform American system of academic heraldry displays the level of the degree, the field of study in which it was earned, and the institution by which it was granted.

It is the hood which provides academic regalia its color and offers the most information about its wearer. The silk lining of the hood bears the color, or colors, of the degree-granting college or university; its velvet facing reveals the color assigned to each area of study. Bachelor's gowns are relatively simple, falling in straight lines from an elaborate yoke and having pointed sleeves. Masters gowns are slightly more elaborate and fasten about the wrist. The Doctor's gown is marked by velvet panels down the front and around the neck, as well as by three bars of the same material on the well-shaped sleeves. It is cut more fully and may be ornamented. The hood worn is three feet in length for Bachelors, three and one-half feet for Masters, and four feet for Doctorates with velvet trimming of two, three, and five inches in width respectively.

The edging, or facing, velvet of academic hoods indicates the area of study. The principal scholarly fields seen in the procession today include:

The American mortarboard, derived from the soft Oxford cap, is black. Its tassel, for holders of the bachelor's and master's degree, is usually black, while gold tassels are worn by holders of doctoral degrees and heads of institutions. The tassel is worn on the right side of the cap by undergraduates, on the left by holders of bachelor's and higher degrees.

### **Admiral Huntington Hardisty, U.S. Navy Vice Chief of Naval Operations**

Admiral Huntington Hardisty is a native of Atlanta, Georgia. A 1952 graduate of the United States Naval Academy, he was designated a Naval Aviator in December 1953 and holds a Master's Degree in International Relations from Harvard University. He assumed his duties as Vice Chief of Naval Operations on 9 March 1987.

During his career Admiral Hardisty has performed a variety of assignments as a Naval Aviator with Flight Squadrons 12, 22, 101 and 102, and as Executive Officer and Commanding Officer of Fighter Squadron 32. He has served as Commander, Carrier Air Wing ELEVEN, and also commanded USS SAVANNAH (AOR 4) and USS ORISKANY (CV 34).

Other assignments include Special Weapons Project Test Pilot for the F3H and F4B Phantom II aircraft at the Naval Air Special Weapons Facility, Albuquerque, New Mexico; Air Operations and Plans Officer on the staff of Commander, Attack Carrier Strike Force Seventh Fleet; Special Plans and Air Operations Officer for Southeast Asia in the office of the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations (Plans, Policy and Operations) (Op 06), and Executive Assistant and Senior Naval Aide to the Director of Navy Program Planning (Op 090).

Admiral Hardisty was Dean of Academics at the Naval War College, Newport, Rhode Island, when he was selected for flag rank in February 1977, and was ordered to assume duties as acting President of the War College. He next assumed command of the U.S. Facility at Subic Bay, Republic of the Philippines and U.S. Naval Forces Philippines in December 1977, serving also as the Commander in Chief Pacific Representative to the Philippines. He attended the CNO Senior Officer Ship Material Readiness Course in Idaho Falls, Idaho, prior to assuming duties as Commander, Carrier Group SEVEN in May 1980. In July 1981, he assumed command of Carrier Strike Force SEVENTH Fleet/Carrier Group FIVE, followed by assignment in July 1982 as Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans, Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet. In September 1983, he was assigned as Assistant Deputy Chief of Naval Operations, Plans, Policy, and Operations (Op-06B). He was subsequently assigned as Director for Operations in June 1984. Most recently, he served as Deputy and Chief of Staff, U.S. Pacific Fleet since February 1986. He assumed command of THIRD Fleet on an additional duty basis from June to August 1986.

Admiral Hardisty is married to the former Sally Mae Ives of St. Petersburg, Florida. They have two sons, John and Robert.

Rear Admiral John A. Baldwin, Jr., a native of Baltimore, Maryland, was graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland and commissioned as Ensign, U.S. Navy in June 1955.

Rear Admiral Baldwin has served at sea in both the Atlantic and Pacific Fleets in USS DENNIS J. BUCKLEY (DDR-808), USS GAINARD (DD-706), USS JEFFERSON COUNTY (LST-845), and USS JOHNSTON (DD-821). He subsequently commanded USS JOHN R. PERRY (DE-1034), commissioned USS MEYERKORD (DE-1058) as her first Commanding Officer, and commanded Destroyer Squadron THIRTY-THREE and Cruiser-Destroyer Group THREE. While in command of Cruiser-Destroyer Group THREE, RADM Baldwin also commanded the KITTY HAWK Battle Group during a deployment to the Western Pacific and Indian Oceans.

Rear Admiral Baldwin has served ashore with the U.S. Naval Small Craft Facility at the Naval Academy; at the University of Washington, Seattle, Washington for postgraduate education in Oceanography; on the staff of the Oceanographer of the Navy; as the senior advisor to the Vietnamese Navy in Military Region II; as part of, and subsequently head of the Sea Control Forces Group in the Systems Analysis Division of the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations; as Deputy Director of the Office of Program Appraisal in the Office of the Secretary of the Navy; as Executive Assistant to the Secretary of the Navy; as Military Assistant to the Deputy Secretary of Defense; as the Director of Operations; and as Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans on the staff of the Commander in Chief U.S. Pacific Fleet. He is currently serving as the President of the Naval War College.

Rear Admiral Baldwin's decorations include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, the Legion of Merit with Gold Star, the Bronze Star with Combat "V," the Meritorious Service Medal, and the Vietnamese Honor Medal First Class.

Rear Admiral Baldwin's wife, Leslie, is also from Baltimore, Maryland. They have two children, Charles and Dorothy.
