

## History of the U.S. Naval War College

Founded in Newport, Rhode Island on October 6, 1884, the Naval War College is the oldest war college in the nation, and the first military service institution in the world to be designated a war college. Commodore Stephen B. Luce was the first president and organized the War College as "a place of original research on all questions relating to war and the statesmanship connected with war, or the prevention of war." These foundations were built upon by Captain Alfred Thayer Mahan, second president of the college, who had originally been selected by Luce to initiate the course in Naval History. Of all the men who were to influence the institution in its early years, none was to have such a profound impact. Mahan's views profoundly affected such leaders as Henry Cabot Lodge and Theodore Roosevelt and through them and others helped shape the United States' destiny at the turn of the century. Mahan's writings published as *The Influence of Seapower Upon History, 1660-1783* gained him worldwide acclaim and established the Naval War College as an internationally respected institution.

Functioning continuously since 1884, except for brief periods during the Spanish-American War and World War I, the War College numbers among its graduates such distinguished naval officers as Admirals Sims, Spruance, King, Nimitz, and Halsey, in addition to many others who today are holding prominent military positions.

The work begun more than one hundred years ago by Luce and Mahan continues today. As graduates well know, the curriculum is both demanding and rewarding. For the military professional, the unique education provided by the Naval War College is unrivaled.

## **General Wallace H. Nutting, USA**

### **Commander in Chief, United States Readiness Command**

General Wallace H. Nutting was born in Newton, Massachusetts, grew up in Saco, Maine, and graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1950.

In the 1950's he served in a variety of command and staff positions in Germany, the United States, and the Republic of Vietnam. He commanded the 1st Squadron, 10th Cavalry at Fort Lewis and deployed with his unit to Vietnam. He also served in the War Plans Division and the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans, Department of the Army.

In the early 1970's, General Nutting returned to Vietnam where he commanded the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment and served as the Deputy Brigade Commander (Operations), 5th Infantry Division. After a tour at the Pentagon, General Nutting became Commanding General of the 1st Infantry Division (Forward) in Germany.

In 1975, General Nutting returned to Washington where he was assigned as the Director of Strategy, Plans and Policy, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans, Department of the Army. In 1977, he returned to Germany to command the 3rd Armored Division. In 1979 he was assigned as the Commander in Chief, U.S. Southern Command, Republic of Panama.

On 22 June 1983, General Nutting assumed the duties of Commander in Chief, United States Readiness Command and Director, Joint Deployment Agency, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida.

General Nutting is a graduate of the College of Naval Command and Staff.



**Rear Admiral James E. Service, USN**  
**President, Naval War College**

Rear Admiral James E. Service was designated a Naval Aviator and commissioned an Ensign in April 1952.

His first tour was with VF 51, during which he deployed in USS VALLEY FORGE to the Korean theater where he flew more than 65 combat missions. Subsequently assigned to the Naval Air Training Command, he was an instructor in All Weather Flight School. In 1957 he joined VA 151 and later served in USS TICONDEROGA.

Senior Project Test Pilot at NATF Lakehurst, from 1961 to 1963, he went from there to the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, CA. After promotion to Commander, he assumed command of VAP 62 followed by a second command tour with VAH 123. He next served as Executive Officer in USS INDEPENDENCE, followed by attendance at the U.S. Army War College.

Following his promotion to Captain, he commanded, in succession, USS SACRAMENTO and USS INDEPENDENCE. Later, while serving as Executive Assistant to VCNO, he was selected for flag rank and reassigned to the staff to DCNO for Air Warfare.

Rear Admiral Service commanded Carrier Group Eight in USS INDEPENDENCE, followed by command of Battle Force Sixth Fleet. While deployed in USS NIMITZ, F14s from his battle force downed two Libyan aircraft in the Gulf of Sidra. He became the 41st President to the Naval War College on 14 October 1982. His personal decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, Air Medal, and Navy Commendation Medal.

Rear Admiral Service is married to the former Natalie Harpst of San Diego, CA. They have three sons; Mark, Bruce (a Marine Corps 1st Lieutenant), and David.



## **Rear Admiral Ronald F. Marryott, USN Prospective President, Naval War College**

Rear Admiral Ronald F. Marryott became the 35th Director, Strategy, Plans, and Policy Division, Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (OP-60) on 1 August 1983. Prior to reporting to OP-60, he served as Commander Iceland Defense Force in Keflavik, Iceland.

Rear Admiral Marryott's first tour of duty was with Patrol Squadron FIVE, Naval Air Station, Jacksonville, Florida, where he qualified as a Patrol Plane Commander in the SP-2E aircraft and participated in deployed operations throughout the North Atlantic and the Mediterranean. While assigned to Patrol Squadron FIVE, RADM Marryott served as the unit's Project Mercury Recovery Officer for the first three manned space launches.

Rear Admiral Marryott was selected for aviation command and reported aboard Patrol Squadron NINE, Naval Air Station, Moffett Field, California, as Executive Officer in February 1972, assuming command of the Squadron in March 1973. Immediately following his initial command tour, Rear Admiral Marryott served briefly as Special Assistant to the Commanding Officer at Naval Air Station, Moffett Field. In fall 1974, he returned to the Washington, D.C., area where he served within the Department of State as the Primary Security Assistance and Sales Action Officer for the Far East Region in the Bureau of Politico-Military Affairs. In 1976, Rear Admiral Marryott was selected to serve as Executive Secretary to the Chief of Naval Operations for Joint Chiefs of Staff matters. He then participated in a special study group within the Office of the Secretary of Defense. Rear Admiral Marryott next completed a tour of duty at the National War College and assumed command of Moffett Field Naval Air Station in September 1979. He was selected for Rear Admiral in February 1981, and reported as Commander Iceland Defense Force in August of that year.

Rear Admiral Marryott is authorized to wear the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Air Medal, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, and the Vietnam Service medal and Campaign Ribbon.

Rear Admiral Marryott is married to the former Carol Ann Westendorf of Elmhurst, New York. They have three sons, Ronald Jr., Robert and Thomas.

### COAT OF ARMS

The trident rising from the waves symbolizes mastery of maritime activities. The three tines of the trident allude to the requirement for the fundamental knowledge of strategy, tactics and logistics necessary to an increased understanding of naval warfare.
